1. Police Report

2. Minutes of the Previous Meeting
Minutes of 07 November 2018 were proposed by David McIntyre and seconded by Hilary Denholm.

3. Matters Arising
Roads / Potholes / Gully Pots

The flooding between Rowanston and Kileekie had been attended to, however there does seem to be a continuing problem; noted that cones are still in place. Cllr PH had reported the Gully issue opposite Maxwellston, problem still outstanding. Other sections of road from Girvan via Dailly to Crosshill are on the schedule of works. A member of the public asked about the plastic barrier at the Rhone Bridge – this is on the schedule, and the crash barrier at the top of the Toll has been completed, though cones might still be on site.

RT advised that there again seems to be a water/burst pipe issue at Eldinton Terrace, nbr 1 / 2. Secretary to get in touch with ARA and Scottish Water.

Daily Trails / SAPI

Due to bad weather the SAPI meeting on 27 November at Straiton was postponed until next year. Secretary met with Rachel Shipley/SAC re the mass of water on Balcarnie Drovers Road – it looks like the one drainage gully is blocked and needs clearing. JF indicated that she would speak with Tom/Balcarnie. Hardcore could possibly be purchased with grant money to help alleviate the problem of deep ruts. Cllr PH indicated that Gregor Scobie/Community Pay-back Team could still be approached.

Windfarms – General

Will keep these headings in place, as a reminder:

Linfairn – no new info.

Tralorg – Brookfield has sold their interest to BayWa r.e. Ltd, possible meeting with new owners in New Year, potentially starting on site in Feb/Mar, with energization expected in late 2019.

Lamboughty – no further info.

Kirkhill – has gone to the reporter again – awaiting result.

Kilgallioch – Dailly is able to apply for funding via Foundation Scotland.

Chirmorie – passed for 22T.

Altercannoch – appeal for 8T, report was finished, still waiting for result.

Millenderdale – road issues, probably nothing happening until 2019.

Glenapp and Arecleoch extensions – application for 22T is to join up the two windfarms.

Secretary revisited the Millenderdale Cumulative Location Plan provided previously by Ellen/Susan Crosthwaite that emphasizes the number of windfarms in the area. Cllr PH pointed out that SAC had indicated to the Scottish Government that South Ayrshire had reached saturation. It is understood that companies are only considering the larger turbines now.

If members of the community have any comments regarding proposed windfarms, they should make their views, whether positive or negative, known to the CC as soon as possible, or direct them straight to the planning application.

Website

HD advised that the website was nearly ready to go live. HD pointed out that there needs to be other people trained up to update the website – suggestions were made, one being to approach the Schools for interested pupils that are involved in IT course/vocational work. Would also advertise on Website/FB/posters. It was agreed to make a proper live opening during January, after necessary updates had been done.

Community Centre WiFi and Christmas Lights

On-going re WiFi. Lights should be switched on shortly. Cllr PH advised that an application for next year's lights should be made now/soonest.

Fly-tipping

JW had visited the site, and agreed that the amount of rubbish was at least a trailer load. Secretary would contact the Forestry Commission in Newton Stewart to find out the name of the landowner re removal of rubbish, and whether gates can be put at both ends of the track.

Heritage Plaque for the School Football Pitch / Heritage Trail / Memorial Bench

The School goal posts will be installed, but need to know if full size or 7 a-side size. LM to check School and advise Secretary.

HD had heard nothing back from the Head Teacher, nor from Andy Lee. Secretary had ordered the Bench and the Plaque. Bargany Estate had agreed wording, and Secretary will forward wording and discuss font size with Ogilvies. It was agreed that the location of the Lectern was near the wall and start of the path around the Memorial Park/opposite the School, and the Bench would be at the opposite end to the three planters at Eldinton Terrace, with a view to Hadyard Hill.

FdF asked about the WW1 project, and the collation of information. After discussion it was agreed that we would try and combine a date for the Lectern/Bench/Project and Website relaunch for say end January. FdF would check with the relevant people.

Play Park

It was decided to drop this for the time being.

Car Parking for School

FdF had advised the Head Teacher to make contact with Tom Burns/SAC Estates.

South Ayrshire Council's Trading Standards

After much communication, the Scheme person is unable to attend our Wednesday CC meetings. The Rural also holds their meetings on a Wednesday. Secretary will try to ascertain if another village group(s) would like to have someone from the Scheme give them a talk. The links to various sites will be put on the Web and FB.

4. Carrick Activity Centre

HM advised that new Sports Hall heaters were in the process of being installed; these would definitely help the attractiveness of using the Hall for activities. The Centre had tried to hold a Christmas Children's Toy/Clothing Fair however it was very poorly attended, possibly due to the short notice, would still try to hold another event next year.

5. Hadyard Hill Community Fund Panel

TMcC was not available. The next meeting was 12 December.

There were three small grant requests:

DCC - Memorial Plaque (as above, and already previously discussed) – full £500 requested - unanimously approved. Pro-forma invoice for both Plaque and Bench provided.

Daily Angling Club – requesting £500 to assist with River Levy – fees have increased considerably (JF gave further info) - unanimously approved. It was also agreed that DAC should come to one of our CC meetings and present themselves.

Daily Scouts – requesting £500 to help with refresher First Aid Course – unanimously approved.

6. Locality Planning / Participatory Budgets / H&SCP

JW and Secretary attended the last meeting – next meeting 12 December. General concern re NHS A&A maternity and sexual health facilities (Letterbox) being dropped or changed without prior consultation. Newsletter being worked on. Meeting notes on CC notice board.

7. Councillor's Report

Cllr PH advised on a number of issues:

- Woodside – trees are needing to be cut back and height reduced. Light and falling tree issues for houses along the street. In consultation with landowner.

- Joint Board Meeting on 11 December regarding budgeting – an ageing demographic is not helping.
- Robert Burns Humanitarian Award closing date on 14 December – please think about a person that could be nominated.
- A new Memorandum of Understanding with the National Trust / Culzean is being worked on – the existing one is over 20 years old.
- Road works are continuing on A77 – Secretary advised that she had not received any notification. Another member commented that the bus companies didn't seem to be fully aware.
- The situation with Ayr train station is on-going. The roof is being attended to. Scottish Government, Network Rail, Historic Scotland and Transport Scotland all involved, together with SAC. Will be endeavouring to have monies returned.
- Had attended the Rural Parliament in Stranraer 14-16 November.
- The updated Blue Book for Community Councillors would be out in January 2019.
- Citizens Advice shops were being phased out of South Ayrshire
- Club Diamonds were being used in more rural areas instead of HARP and Invigor8.

8. Any Other Business

Waste/Dog Bin at West End – Hasn't been emptied for quite a while – Secretary to check SAC/Tommy Howieson.

Daily Cemetery Gates – A member of the public noticed that the gates were in need of attention, Secretary contacted Lizzie Linton/SAC – they are being repaired in Spring 2019.

Community Council Elections 2019 – DMcI indicated that he would not be standing. He had been involved since the start of Hadyard Hill, and had taken on the small grants distribution. FdF had indicated that she would take on this role.

McColls Fundraising – Andy MacFarlane, Manager of the Dailly Branch asked whether there was any particular project that the Village as a whole would like promoted for fundraising. £600 had already been raised and this will be put towards a new project. The previous beneficiary had been the Defibrillator. Members indicated that they would investigate from the Community what they would like. Any ideas can be given to any member of the CC.

Notice Board – The NB by McColls isn't opening properly, Secretary has been liaising with the supplier and will be contacting Morrisons.
