1. Police Report

Dailly Trails and Dalquharran

SAC is progressing with various quotes for boardwalks and stile repairs on the Barony River Walk. The Drovers Road between Balcamie and Whitehill should also be repaired soon. Still investigating where to install self-closing gates using the Paths for All Grant. SAC waiting for quote re strimming/clearing the River path around the Memorial Park.

Dalquharran has completed felling work though re-instatement works on-going. Public looking forward to having the Bridge and Path to the Old Castle open soon.

No update yet on the possible new paths as per SAC website/News – checking Cllr AC.

Wind Farms – General

Per headings below, as a reminder:

Clauchrie – our objection was submitted 27 February to Consents Unit - ECU 00002001 (ref 074). Have received advice that SAC has formally objected. *Now going to Public Inquiry* – *DPEA* – *WIN-370-3* – *it is possible to watch the proceedings*.

Craiginmoddie – 16T upto max 230m in height – basically in area of ex-Hadyard Hill Extension – Energie Kontor – ECU00002080 – scoping response sent 20 July.

Carrick Forest – 17T upto 200m high – ECU00002063 – in scoping, response sent for Scoping. SPR asking for any input re Recreational Enhancements. *There will be an Online Public Information Event from 14 Oct to 4 Nov – local communities should have received a notification in the mail – link is: www.scottishpowerrenewables.com/carrickwindfarm*

Arecleoch Extension – 13T plus associated infra – refused by SAC, SPR resubmitting.

Kirk Hill – planning extension granted to 2022 – requesting an increase in height from 110 to 115.5m – appealing Energy Consents Unit – PPA-370-2086.

Tralorg – BayWa r.e. – waiting for update, all gone quiet.

Lamboughty – no further info.

Linfairn – no new info.

Kilgallioch – Extension being scoped.

Chirmorie – passed for 22T – renewal of planning permission.

Altercannoch – refused on appeal for 8T by reporter.

Millenderdale – SAC refused for 5T.

Glenapp – no additional info.

Mark Hill substation extension – does this mean more turbines?

Hadyard Hill – turbine number 44 or 45 has been removed.

If members of the community have any comments regarding proposed windfarms, they should make their views, whether positive or negative, known to the CC as soon as possible, or direct them straight to the planning application.

Dobbingstone and Newlands Woodland Creation Proposals
Our responses were submitted 20 and 04 September, respectively.

3. Hadyard Hill Community Fund Panel and Small Grant Fund

The Panel held their first meeting on 28 Sep – this was an induction for some, as well as approving one application from Dailly Scouts for £5,000 for a programme of outdoor activity days. Next deadline is 31 October with Panel meeting in December – applications at: www.foundationscotland.org.uk/programmes/hadyard-hill-dailly/.

There were two important questions raised at the Panel meeting – an Endowment Fund (so that we will have some funding available once the existing Fund has finished in 10-years time) and the need to carry out a Community Action Plan (similar to the one done in 2010, so that we establish what the Village wants moving forward and how we should achieve this). A virtual meeting will be held shortly with Foundation Scotland to discuss both these issues. One major change agreed at the Panel meeting was to increase the maximum amount to £10,000.

Small Grants Fund – there have been no applications.

4. Treasurer's Report

Nothing new to report. Balance in CC Account as at 07 October - £13,640.69.

Dailly CC Development Account balance remains at £1,501.56.

5. Councillors Report

Cllr AC indicated that he would like to try and have a virtual meeting – Secretary to check with members. He is waiting to hear back re the New Paths issue.

Cllr AC forwarded a request to lobby support for investment and improvements of A77, and A75 corridors. Consisting of SAC, D&G, North Antrim Council as well as MPs and MSPs, Ferry Operators, and others – this will be a powerful lobbying group. They need input from CCs, local organisations/associations, as well as individuals. The aim is to bring investment and upgrade to the trunk route infrastructure. Secretary will coordinate with members to produce a supporting letter.

At the last SAC meeting on 01 October, a Climate Change Policy had been approved, which could make a huge difference to the operation of the Council and, for example, planning. There was also discussion about Events such as Remembrance Sunday and Christmas Lights taking place during C-19 - documentation should become available soon. Relating to Christmas Lights, Secretary to get in touch with the Community Association for their input. Secretary to speak with RT regarding a Wreath for Remembrance Sunday.

Cllr AC advised of the passing of Peter Walker of Pinmore & Pinwherry last week. He had been a very active member of the Community and had been Chair of P&P CC for a number of years.

6. Any Other Business

Vegetation Clearance – Toll Road – Secretary was in touch with ARA re clearing the pavement – they have indicated that they will be scrapping and clearing it away soon.

Village Action Group – FdF brought up re having an Action Group of volunteers to take on litter picking, strimming, sign cleaning. To pursue.
