<p><b>Creative Scotland – Radical Care</b></p>	<p>Up to £15,000</p>	<p>Open ~ deadline <b>26/11/2021</b></p>	<p><b>Radical Care</b></p> <p>Creative Scotland has identified that many people experience barriers to working or progressing in the arts, screen, and creative industries, as a result of caring responsibilities. Radical Care is an action research project for organisations in these industries that wish to try out new approaches to support those with caring responsibilities.</p> <p>Through the fund, Creative Scotland is looking to help offset the risk of initial investment in projects, to encourage applicants to test theoretical ideas, share best practice, as well as any common pitfalls to help others avoid similar challenges in the future. The programme aims to help organisations address some of the structural inequalities which are embedded in traditional working practices and leave a positive long-term legacy in working structures and practices that others can learn from.</p> <p><b>Value Notes</b></p> <p>The scheme has a budget of up to £75,000 to support a selection of pilot or demonstration projects in Scotland’s creative industries. Grants of between £3,000 and £15,000 are available. Creative Scotland expects to support between five and fifteen projects (depending on demand).</p> <p><b>Who Can Apply</b></p> <p>Arts, screen, and creative industries organisations in Scotland are eligible to submit applications to run pilot or demonstration projects. Creative Scotland is interested in projects from across all art forms that connect and support Scotland’s creative industries. These can include, but are not limited to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Co-working spaces.</li> <li>• Artist’s studios.</li> <li>• Community arts organisations.</li> <li>• Incubators.</li> <li>• Workshops.</li> <li>• Creative hubs.</li> <li>• Residency providers.</li> <li>• Creative collectives and networks.</li> </ul>
