5. Matters Arising

*SAC/Ranger Service*

## 6. Wind Farms – General

Per headings below (have taken away ones that have not been updated recently):

**Clauchrie to Knockodhar overhead lines** – SPR - waiting ECU advice.

**Knockcronal** – Scoping – ECU00002181 – response lodged - ex-Linfairn, now 9T up to 200m, and 3T up to 180m. Public Events at Dailly and Straiton. Stratkraft/ECU – extension until 14 February. Objection submitted 13 February.

**Clauchrie** – Consents Unit - ECU00002001 (ref 074). SAC formally objected. Public Enquiry – DPEA – WIN-370-3 – is now with the Reporter – a lot of controversy.

**Craiginmoddie** – reduced to 14T up to max 200m – basically ex-Hadyard Hill Extension – Energie Kontor. Full consultation ECU00002196 – response submitted to ECU. Additional Information consultation response submitted 13 January 2022. SAC had objected at their Regulatory meeting on 03 February.

**Carrick Forest** – reduced to 13T up to 200m inc Energy Storage System – ECU00002063 – scoping response sent. *Full consult, ECU00003392 – response submitted on 28 May 2022.*

**Arcleoch Extension** – 13T plus infra – Public Enquiry DPEA/WIN-370-2 – approved.

**Kirk Hill** – planning extension granted to 2022 – height now 115.5m. *New developer – Ripple Energy - Invite to next CC meeting in July.*

**Tralorg** – operational since 21 Oct 2020. *Funds received.*

**Knockodhar** – 32T tip height up to 200m inc Energy Storage System. South side of Stinchar Valley. In Scoping ECU00002153 – sent response 27 November 2020.

**Scienteuch** – new wind farm, have not received anything officially – ECU00003318 – 9T, up to 200m – basically Lamdoughty and Keirs Hill, NE of Straiton, S of Patna.

**If members of the community have any comments regarding proposed windfarms, they should make their views, whether positive or negative, known to the CC as soon as possible, or direct them straight to the planning application.**

## 7. Paths / Dailly Trails / Dalquharran / Brunston

Rachel Shipley/SAC advised that Jamieson had been approved to complete the repair/upgrade of ‘accessible’ path around the Memorial Park, over the Fish/Artist Bridge to the Old Castle. Part of the VAT refund will be used for this.

## 8. Roads / Potholes / Gully Pots

Back Road repair/resurfacing has been completed quicker than expected. Everyone very pleased. A shame that the School Car Park was unable to be completed at the same time.

## 9. Hadyard Hill Community Fund Panel and Small Grant Fund

PW advised that the next Panel meeting was on 14 June. Secretary advised that Foundation Scotland sent a communication re the Endowment Fund – change in rate and contribution to FS (reduction in our case) as well as timing, name change to Community Invested Fund. Update of the Agreement, which will be unchanged in principle.

Clare Graham/FS requested a copy of the CAP - Secretary agreed to send a pdf copy. As HHCF had made available a £10,000 grant, and the full invoice had been paid, it was agreed that the balance of approx £2,000 should be returned into the Main Fund.

Secretary had not received an acknowledgement of our letter to SSE re litter/speeding vans. Will endeavour to proceed with the SSE/MW issue in the coming months.

FdF advised that she had received the balance of documents from Dailly Anglers and could proceed with the grant.

During general discussion, it was agreed that some of the available funding could go towards upgrading paths, and possibly making better use of the open ground on the river side of the Memorial Park (eg benches/tables/green gym). More discussion on ownership and vehicle for funding applications was needed. This is all part of the CAP outcome and reason for possible Development Trust/similar.

Kilgallioch Community Small Grant Fund £2,000 – assigned to CAC, Tralorg £19,300 received on 25 May 2022, and Kirk Hill Community Benefit Funding to be discussed.

## 10. Community Action Plan

CAP booklets were distributed in the village and Secretary mailed a number, leaving a balance if required. It was thought the Jubilee event might not be an appropriate time to discuss the CAP. Another event could be held later in the year to try and instigate action on some of the suggestions. Secretary received copies of the full report from Comm Enterprise.

## 11. Community Council Elections and Constitution

There were no comments on the Constitution, and members agreed that it should be adopted and signed. As our Link Officer was not in attendance, it would be signed at the next CC meeting. Declarations of Interest must also be available then to hand over to the Link Officer.

It was agreed that we should advertise for the two vacancies, and ET agreed that she would still like to be our Specialist Co-optee. Secretary to check the process for both.

12. Carrick Activity Centre

Nothing to update, except that the Centre would be open on Friday 03 June during the Jubilee for badminton and table tennis, free of charge, to encourage more use of the Sports Hall. It would be closed on the Saturday.

The EV Charger at the CAC car park will soon be advertised on ARA social media sites.

13. Councillor's Report

Cllr PH advised that new councillors were finding their feet. As indicated previously there is a PWS drought warning especially in the Barr and P&P.

There appears to be a high turnover of staff in the H&SC system causing delays in releasing people from hospital. The cost of living is causing increased charges for everything, making everything more expensive including contractors.

SAC is constantly reviewing working from home policy, and appointments are being used when appropriate.

14. Treasurer's Report

FdF advised following balances - DCD a/c: £1,173, DCC a/c: £39,475.

15. Any Other Business

*CC Survey* – Secretary had sent out SAC's request, and asked members to submit by 03 June.

*Girvan Tourist Office* – is open at the back of the Girvan Town House – 1100 – 1500hrs – please display/advise them of any events.

*Carers Week* – Monday 06 June – theme is 'Making Caring Visible, Valued and Supported'.

*Call for CC signatories – UK Forest Standard* – we have been asked to put our/CC signature to 'Communities for Diverse Forestry'. In general discussion it was agreed that it might be the right thing to do, encouraging more involvement with/from communities in light of forest expansion in South Scotland. There will be other requests later in the year for signature especially re Biodiversity.

*SAC Information & Advice Hub* – request for how to make people more aware of their services – more appropriate that Comm Association handle this, as they can invite them to the Comm Centre.

*SAC Household Waste Recycling Booking System* – SAC is last in the country to operate this booking system. Should help with deterring waste disposal from people from outside South Ayrshire. Becomes live on 04 July, and will be widely advertised.

*Under Sky Play Event* – a group that can organise play events for 4-9 year olds, will pass to School/PTA.
